





eastly began as a simple suggestion from Alexander Tochilovsky while working on the Lubalin 100 logotype. While it imbues many of the qualities of Lubalin's team of lettering artists' signature styles, it's a completely new design. Alexander and I agreed it was simply too expected to ape an existing typeface, so we tried to create something new.

The year prior, I had done some lettering for the Typographics conference, that slowly snowballed into several other ideas of typefaces. The most basic of those was something generically titled Ohno Fatface.

Without much of a reason why, I started drawing out the rest of the capitals. My thinking at the time was that it might be useful to have a full alphabet for various collateral for the project. Also, numbers were needed in a smaller optical size so I took a crack at those as well.

Around this time, DJR's Rhodedendron came out, so I had a good reference for how a slab treatment could be applied to numerals. This was not the first time and will not be the last time I rip off DJR.

I had nothing driving this project except for my own curiosity. I wondered what a lowercase for this super slab design might look like, so I played around with making the slabs absurdly enormous.

In all of my classes, I like to talk about the "Counterspace Equals Letterspace" technique for achieving consistent spacing in type or lettering. Basically, this approach involves a blackletter-esque concept, where there is no difference...

[7][8] In 2017 Joe Dart was ranked as No Treble's 5th-favorite bassist.[9] Vulfpeck's first live show was at the Blind Pig in Ann Arbor, Michigan, followed by a concert in New York City at the Rockwood Music Hall in October 2017.[7][9] The band released its third EP, My First Car, in August 2017. The EP's first track features a vocal performance by Antwaun Stanley the band's first track featuring a VOCAL PERFORMANCE.[10] A RE-

IN MARCH 2014 VULFPECK RELEASED SLEEPIFY, A 10-TRACK SILENT ALBUM ON SPOTIFY, IN ORDER TO GENERATE FUNDS FOR A-FREE TOUR. THE ALBUM GENERATED \$20,000° IN ROYALTIES OVER A TWO-MONTH PERIOD.[11] SUBSEQUENTLY SPOTIFY REMOVED THE ALBUM, STATING IT VIOLATED THEIR TERMS OF CONTENT.[22] THE BAND'S ROYALTY GENERATION PLAN GAINED INTERNATIONAL PRESS. In 2014 the band announced the Sleepily Tour and released its fourth EP, Fugue State.[7][9] The EP's second track "1612" references some Wardell Quezergue's works and features Antwaun Stanley on vocals.[18] The admission-free Sleepily Tour was scheduled for September 2014.[11] Tour locations included San Francisco, Los Angeles, Chicago, Ann Arbor and New York City. [19] In 2015 Stratton proposed a more equitable model for Spotify payout distribution in which each artist's payout is based solely on that artist's listeners, rather than simply every listener



Vulfpeck released[4] Thrill of the arts in october 2015. THE ALBUM HAD FEATURES FROM Several Musicians including David T Walker. Charles Jones & Blake Mills. The band's 3rd album, Mr Finish Line, was released in November 2017. It featured veteran instrumentalists James Gadson, Bootsy Collins, Michael Bland, David T. Walker, and vocalists Antwaun Stanley, Coco O., Charles Jones. Christine Hucal, & Joey Dosik.[3]

The band's production aesthetic is modeled after live television performances of the past, such as Midnight Special. Whistle Test. and Beat-Club. The band aims for a stripped down sound where each instrument contributes and does not dominate.[31] Recordings are done live with real instruments. and very rarely are different takes cut and mixed. Occasionally tape recording is used for effect. The compositions are modeled after unconventional song structures of the past, such as "Ooh Child" with an A and B section in which each section provides a lift, and "If you Want Me to Stay" where a repetitive eight bar progression is used.[2][31]

In 2018 band's label, Vuli Records, put out an EP by the Fearless Flyers quartet consisting of drummer Nate Smith, bassist Joe Dart, and
